## **ORATORY/SPEECH GUIDELINES AND INFORMATION**

- You must be a high school student to participate. (Only juniors and seniors can go on to the state and national contests.)
- Speeches should be 5 to 7 minutes long (approx. 750 1050 words).
- You may use notes or index cards, but no visual aids.
- Speeches do not have to be memorized.
- Speeches will be considered by a panel of three judges.
- Judging criteria are as follows:
  - 1. Introduction (10 points)
    - a. How well is the speech laid out at the beginning?
    - b. Does it have a clear thesis?
    - c. Does it make you want to hear more?
  - 2. Content (10 points)
    - a. Does it have a logical, clear organization?
    - b. Good word usage?
    - c. Is each point relative to the topic and substantiated by current documentation?
    - d. Does it send a pro-life message?
  - 3. Presentation (10 points)
    - a. Appropriate eye contact, audibility, rate of delivery
    - b. Gestures, appearance, general sense of confidence
  - 4. Conclusion (10 points)
    - a. Does conclusion sum up main points of speech?

## **GENERAL SUGGESTIONS**

- Research and understand your subject; your speech will reflect your efforts.
- Believe in what you are saying; speak with enthusiasm, but maintain your poise.
- Be creative; the judges are interested in hearing *YOUR* point of view.
- Practice your speech in front of others, and invite constructive criticism in order to perfect your content and delivery.
- <u>Do not plagiarize</u>. Verbally cite your sources. (e.g. "Mother Theresa said...") Even borrowing basic ideas from other people without citation is plagiarism. If plagiarism is detected and confirmed, you will be disqualified.
- Keep outside sources to a minimum. This is your speech not a report of someone else's.

- Keep in mind the judging criteria when practicing and giving your speech.
- Dress appropriately jacket and tie suggested for men, dresses suggested for women).
